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## Our Happenin' Auxiliary

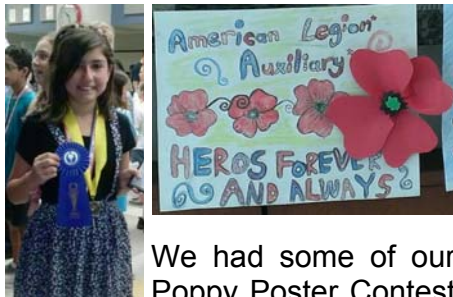
WOW! What a busy couple of month's we've had and the next few months will be even busier.

BankFIRST in Oviedo allowed us to decorate their front desk with some of our contest entries.



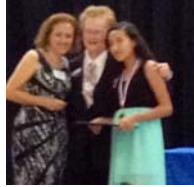
Our poster contest winner, Jenna, and her winning entry:

### CENTURION BATTALION

Thank you for your support of the Centurion Battalion during this past year. We have concluded our monthly trainings for the 2013 to 2014 year and now we have over 90% of our cadets attending Summer Specialty trainings all over the United States. The post has given us a place to teach and prepare these young adults the meaning of HONOR, COURAGE AND COMMITMENT in their daily lives and making stronger citizens for our great nation. Of the six who have graduated from high school three have enlisted in the U.S. Navy and two of those are going into BUD's training (SEAL) from boot camp. The three other graduates are attending college and hope to enlist after college.

We have had a total of 15 cadets either graduate or decided not to continue this next year. However, we have had inquires from more than 35 young adults who want to join the program for this next year. This program is working and it has proven that with guidance these young adults can become physically and mentally tough to take on the challenges they will face in the future.

WE ARE NO LONGER NUMBER ONE BUT WE ARE NOW NUMBER TWO IN THE NATION. Some may look at this as a negative however now we have a goal to be NUMBER ONE again. Our Cyber Patriot Team was the NUMBER ONE USNSCC team in the nation. This program had over 700 teams throughout the United States and our team in its first year ended up **number 9** overall after a final competition in Washington, D.C. What an accomplishment by these young adults.

One of the new things we are going to do in this coming 2014-2015 year is to be more active in helping veterans and service personnel. We are also having a 32 hour introduction to the new cadets coming on board which will be led by our midshipman's and instructors. Many of our staff and, as stated earlier, 90% of our cadets will be training during the next three months. Some will be in Norfolk, Va., Naval Academy, NAS Jax, San Diego, Calif. to mention a few of the different locations.

Once again we want to THANK YOU Winter Park Memorial Post 112 for your continued support of this great program. You have allowed us to continue to shape young minds and bodies to be better citizens of our great NATION.

## ***YOUR POST 112 IN ACTION-AGAIN!***

This year, as in years past, we presented 31 Medals and Framed Certificates to 16 Young Men and 15 Young Ladies in 16 local Schools. These awards are presented at each of their respective Schools Awards Ceremony at the end of the School year. The young people selected must be "graduating" from the school they are attending and moving to a different school for the next grade. We present these at the Elementary, Middle, and High School level. We ask the Faculty of the School to recommend the recipients of the Award. The points for consideration include **Courage, Honor, Leadership, Patriotism, Scholarship, and Service** and the individuals selected are those who have shown these traits during the school year, and in their personal lives.

The first full week in June was a busy one for the Post. We presented Medals to the following Schools; *Aloma, Audubon Park, Brookshire, Chickasaw, Dommerich, Eastbrook, Killarney, Lake Sybelia, Lakemont, Red Bug, Lawton and Winter Springs*. We will also present to *Glenridge Middle, Maitland Middle, Pace-Brantley School and Winter Park High School* before the end of the school year.

This youth program costs your post about \$400.00 in Medals, Certificates and Frames. You the members donate your time and gas to be present at the Awards Event to personally present these awards on behalf of the Post and The American Legion. **We wish to thank the members for helping in making presentations. Several**

**individuals did multiple schools the same day. Thanks to our Commander Billy Dover who lead by example and did five schools.** PLEASE think about volunteering next year to present. ## VAMC UPDATE: Ted Costello

The latest news on the new VA Hospital at Lake Nona is the contractor is scheduled to hand over the keys in April 2015. There will be a "phase-in" period to allow equipment, furniture and personnel to become familiar with the facility and procedures. Opening and patient care is hoped to start in approximately August 2015 and the last phase which will be the in-patient care unit opening sometime in 2016. There is no word yet what will be done with the old medical center. There is hope that the old nursing home will be turned over to the Florida Department of Veterans Affairs as a state veterans nursing home facility and the medical center will handle mental health issues, and the good Lord knows our veterans need help!

## HELP OUR POST GET RECOGNITION!

Help us to get recognition as a Post!

Every year, we try to guess at a lot of the efforts that you, the members, have put into the Post, its activities and the community. In the American Legion, recognition is all that we can give and it is high time that our members received it, too!

1. Veterans affairs and rehabilitation – Time and travel to the VA Clinic or VA Hospital to support and assist the VA and the veterans, time spent on the Saturdays when the veterans attend the Pancake Breakfast and visiting with them, time and mileage investigating the TFA and Gilchrist awards, plus various small projects and favors for our veteran family. Time spent volunteering with the Red Cross, CERT or other civic preparedness groups, time and money spent in making improvements around our Post, time and mileage involved in donating blood are also activities included in the VA & R program.

2. National Security – Do you volunteer with the Kids in Support of Soldiers (KISS) helping to pack the goody boxes shipped to our active duty soldiers? Did you bring under-

wear to the Post in support of the Auxiliary “*Show You Care, Bring Underwear*” campaign? Do you clip coupons for the Auxiliary program that ships coupons to overseas bases? The time you spend helping KISS, the time you spend shopping for items shipped to soldiers and the money you spend supporting these projects are all great examples of our National Security programs.

3. Americanism – This would be the time spent working with the Boy Scouts (Adults and Youth), time spent working with the school medal programs (all levels), time spent publicizing, finding and even possible coaching of youth for both the Oratorical Contest AND Boys State, taking the time to distribute flags or Legion coloring books to the local schools OR even the time making contact and working on gathering the information for the “Teacher, Firefighter and Law Officer” of the year. All of these programs take time and it is high time that you got the credit for your efforts.

4. Children and Youth – This can be the hours that you spend working with the Sea Cadets, participation in the “Christmas In July” or the “Halloween Party” or anything that we do for the youth in the area. Supporting the Auxiliary School Supply drive is another example of a Children and Youth activity where we can get credit for the time and money spent by our Post members helping our sister Auxiliary with one of their projects. Remember we ARE a Legion FAMILY! **Anything Post members**

**do assisting with a SAL or Auxiliary project can be counted under our programs, too!**

These are just a few of the areas that many of you are already spending time by your own choice. If you are doing something and don't know if it “counts” - just ask your Adjutant!

Now, take a few minutes each month and let us show the District, Department, and even National that we are an active and vibrant force in the Veteran's world. Let me know if you want more examples of how we support the Legion Family and it's programs.

Please turn in your hours, miles and money spent to the Adjutant at each meeting OR you can send the information by email if that's easier. We want to have you and your post recognized for what we do for the American Legion and veterans and their families as well as our country.
